

# Macleod needs final draw to

The skips made just one of four shots in the final end of the Battleford Ladies Bonspiel's main event, but for Phyllis Macleod, one of two was all she needed.

Macleod, with last shot in the Reeves Grand Challenge event, drew to the four-foot ring for a single point and 6-5 win over the Jean Guest foursome. Guest, who'd needed takeout shots to come back from a three-point deficit at one point, was heavy with both attempts to draw the house. Macleod had missed trying to peel a guard.

The Guest rink, who stole three in the ninth to tie the score, got a rock behind a guard earlier in the 10th, but a shot by Macleod's third, Marilyn Sloan, removed both the guard and the Guest counter and the house was void of rocks as Guest released her first stone.

Macleod, also aided by Olive Pulsford and Sylvia Stephenson, counted two in both the first and fifth ends and another in the seventh.

Guest scored singles in the third and sixth. The latter was supported by Linda Killoran, Tillie Lampitt and Linda Moore. Macleod beat Lynn Remeshylo to advance to the final while Guest had defeated Rose Lamson.

"We weren't shooting well," said Killoran later. "We were lucky to be in the game. It seemed we were always looking at a lot of Macleod stones."

In the Lewchuck Insurance event, the Helen Wohlberg rink, skipped by Marian Miller, defeated Marion Scott's foursome 10-9, when the Scott front end, needing a steal of two to send the match into an extra end, swept their skip's last stone too much near the start of its course. It slid through the house to leave a rock in the house and no need for Miller's last shot. Scott's first draw attempt was exposed and Miller played the hit and roll. Another Scott rock was biting the 12-foot behind some cover.

Miller, with Marion Wohl-

berg, Helen Wohlberg and Barb Thompson, had taken command in the second, and again in the eighth, with four-point ends, taking singles in the third and fifth. Scott had deuces in the first, sixth and ninth ends and singles in the fourth and a steal of one in the seventh. (The Wohlberg rink advanced to the final over Ida Gillatt while Gail Mitscke had fallen to Scott.)

In the eighth, Scott, who was backed by Anne Waldbillig, Joanne Andrews and Gail Goertz, was narrow on a tap-back of the closest counter, rubbing a guard, but rolled to the side for second shot. Miller removed that stone, and nudged another Scott rock off to the side, and rolled in for four. Scott needed a measurement in her favor to avoid giving up five on the end.

The Ev's Beauty Salon event was taken by Carol Christopher, 7-3 over Jean McNabb. After giving up one in the first end Christopher, backed by Chris Omelchen-

ko, Marj Muth and Ellen Balendine, scored two in the second, stole two more in the third, and added another two-point steal in the sixth. McNabb, who got help from Wilma McLeod, Marg Penner and Shirley Peters, netted singles in the first, fourth and eighth. She ran out of rocks in the tenth after the ninth was blanked.

The Debbie Halter foursome won the Battleford Drug Mart event, with Betty Mann having her final shot roll out of the house after a hit on a Halter counter, down one with the hammer coming home. Neither rink netted more than a point in any end, with Halter scoring in the first, second, fourth, sixth and ninth ends and Mann counting on the third, fifth, seventh and eighth.

Supporting Halter were Barb Mitchell, Val Cawood and Joanne Lucarz, while Mann's help came from Doris Sheppard, Lil Edwards and Gladys Good.

Nona Cross came back from giving up a six-ender in the second to tie the score in the eighth, but Joy Opheim prevailed by collecting two more in the ninth as well as scoring in the tenth to win the Revelstoke event. Opheim, backed by Shirley Leier, Olga Maybuck and Audrey Blais, also got two in the fifth and stole one in the sixth. Cross, aided by Marilyn Morrison, Norma Dalshaug and Renilda Kemp, recovered with singles in the first and fourth, two in the third and four in the eighth, which tied matters at 9-9. But with one and possible two Opheim counters in the tenth, both tap-back tries wrecked on guards.

The Francis Mitchell foursome carried the Sherwood Grocery event, defeating Donna Jamieson. Rounding out the Mitchell crew were Phyllis Scotton, Goldie Steele and Peggy Francis, while the other members of the Jamie-

son quartet were Norma Kratchmer, Beth Degenstein and Marion Sayers.

Finishing third in the Ev's event were the Shirley Flet-

cher rink, while Clara Shephard came fourth.

Third in the Battleford Drug Mart event was Sheila Orchison with Evelyn Bowers

taking fourth.
